40. COMMISSIONER REPORTS

50. COUNCIL LIAISON REPORT

CM Boyer discussed the continuing efforts of the Council, Mayor and Staff on the biennium budget. He indicated that this budget cycle is a competitive situation with ever increasing departmental budgets and revenue projections remain flat to meet these needs.

70. CITIZEN COMMENTS

70.1 Dutch Heetbrink presented a proposal to launch a “Lynnwood Performance Arts Center” and to gain the Commission’s and City’s support. He discussed in detail how the program works, his need for a space and why he chose Lynnwood as a place to try and establish is program.

80. BUSINESS ITEMS

80.1 **City Hall Project Update & Committee Selection:** Com. Segalla presented to commissioners the current design development schemes that are under development by the ad-hoc committee. Com. van den Bosch moved to add Com. Richards to the Ad Hoc committee, Com. Moore second, motion passed.

80.2 **2015 Library Gallery Call & Schedule:** Install dates are now firm. The call for artist documentation wording and how to handle controversial pieces was discussed. Deputy Olson will work to finalize the application and issue the call for artists.

80.3 **Shakespeare in the Park Schedule & Hosting:** Shifts were selected for arts commissioners to attend.

80.4 **Celebrate! Briefing & Art planning:** Event is July 19th. Staff presented floor plans and event schedule to commissioners. Commissioners signed up for time slots to be present and manage the arts commission event tables.

80.5 **BayFest Youth Theater Planning:** Event is July 27th. Ad hoc committee of Commissioners Moore, Lunsford and Heringer is working with staff to provide picnic lunch.

80.6 **Social Media Update:** City of Lynnwood Facebook page is now up. Staff presented social media policy documents. It was discussed some of the legal implications of being a representative of city government and issues related to posting.

80.7 **Mission, Vision, Goal & Budget Discussion:**

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- Staff prepared and discussed with commissioners several documents including a letter from Director Sordel about the need for a paradigm shift which is beginning to happen that has challenged the way the City of Lynnwood is delivering services to the community.
- CM Boyer encouraged commissioners to remain involved, be creative and aggressive about arts commission needs.

 - Meet with council in a face-to-face meeting.
