30. APPROVAL OF MINUTES - June 21, 2016 minutes approved as distributed

40. COMMISSIONER & AD HOC REPORTS

- Com. Richards presented handouts about the Luminous Forest art project in Edmonds. He discussed how it is a collaborative project between the City and private organizations.
- Com. Segalla spoke about Westlake Park in downtown Seattle. He mentioned how it was an under-utilized space that has been transformed into a communal area with games, tables, and events.

50. COUNCIL LIAISON REPORT

- Council member Boyer announced there will be a "Love Thy Neighbor" Peace Rally, Thursday, July 21st in response to recent tragedies. He gave an update on council activities which included working on land use policies, heritage plan, budget deliberations, filling the City's Human Resource Director position and appointing an interim deputy police chief. He also mentioned that council members will be out and about during National Night Out promoting the online budget survey.

60. STAFF REPORT

- CPC Wong reported that the Senior Center Art Committee is interested in collaborating with the Arts Commission in curating the Senior Center's art gallery. The gallery committee will meet to discuss options, benefits and disadvantages of involving the Arts Commission.

70. CITIZEN COMMENTS

- Robin Westbrook expressed interest in supporting Senior Center's art gallery.
- Robert Gutcheck suggested that we can ask commercial companies to donate or give discounts on art gallery equipment to the City, such as track lighting.

80. BUSINESS ITEMS

80.1 City Center: Wayfinding and gateway signage (tourism Manager Mary Monroe)

Tourism Manager Mary Monroe presented designs for the City's new wayfinding and gateway signs. She clarified that the signs are not funded and the project is in the concept phase. The proposed designs for the wayfinding and gateway signs were well received by the commission. Some feedback was provided.

80.2 Updates: New wrap idea, Stories, Public Art maintenance

- Com. van den Bosch and Com. Welsh reported that they will do the Public Art condition assessment tomorrow, July 20.
- CPC Wong announced that a second wrap project (at Alderwood Mall Blvd & 40th) is under consideration, and has received a go-ahead from the traffic engineer. The commission discussed different ideas for the second wrap project. We think that a strategy to organize future wraps is to base it on the location of the box. A box could feature art by students at a nearby school or Boys & Girls Club, a historical building or event, or an activity like biking on a nearby trail.
- CPC Wong gave an update on the City's stories that Com. Walsh will be working with an Edmonds CC alumnus to edit the video stories.

80.3 Summer Programs Planning (Shakespeare, Afro-Latino Festival, Ubuntu Expose)

- -The commissioners discussed which nights they could attend Shakespeare in the Park.
- CPC Wong reminded the commission of the Afro-Latino Festival on Aug 6th
- CPC Wong announced that the City will assist the Ubuntu Expose on Aug 20th by creating graphic design, help with providing a hands-on art project, and endorsing the event. He asked for volunteers for the art project.
- CPC Wong mentioned that staff will be out on National Night Out promoting "Love Your Block Mini Grants"

Program & Project Updates

Visual Exhibits

City Hall Art Gallery shows Jerry Steffen from July 30 to September 30.

- Youth Art Exhibits: Nicole Yang exhibits from August 2 to 30. Sophie Zhang exhibit runs August 30 to October 4.
- Plan to install new track at City Hall on wall in council chambers hallway just past reception desk. Plan to exhibit Korean American artists at that location to coincide with the visit from Damyang's Mayor.
- Plan to exhibit work from Latino Art Club starting at end of August in main lobby/pool viewing area.

Public Art

Commissioners van den Bosch and Walsh inspected many of the art objects and gave staff a condition report. Staff contacted ArtSite to schedule the maintenance in September.

Wrap Project (old and new)

A plan is being formulated to organize the 60 signal box locations to base it on the location's significance. A box could feature art by students at a nearby school or Boys & Girls Club, a historical building or event, or an activity like biking on a nearby trail.

Shakespeare in the Park

July 13 & 14 shows of Hamlet had 275 (\$765 donations) and 400 (\$1375) respectively. July 20 & 21 shows of Love's Labour's Lost had 265 (\$985 donations) and 305 (\$1100) respectively. July 28 show of The Merry Wives of Windsor had 375 (\$____ donations). August 4 show of Cymbeline had 265 (\$____ donations).

Afro-Latino Festival

The event was very successful, with 500-1000 people attending. PRCA department, Police, our partners Community Transit and Aegis had booth space.

National Night Out

Staff visited 8 neighborhoods, talked about Love Your Block Mini-grants, and arts and heritage happenings.

Love Your Block Mini-grants

We have awarded 5 grants: a block party, neighborhood emergency preparedness kits, decorated themed mail boxes on one street, neighborhood entrance beautification, adding pollinator friendly plants.

Stories

We've hired a video editor, an EdCC alumnus, to create the videos.

Ubuntu Expose

Members of Arts Commission will offer the "Adornment" hands-on art activity.
