30. APPROVAL OF MINUTES – Minutes from September 20 were approved as distributed.

40. COMMISSIONER & AD HOC REPORTS

- Com. Richards reported that he attended the Oct. 10th City Council Business Meeting to commend the City for proclaiming October as National Arts and Humanities Month.
- Com. Lunsford announced that the History and Heritage Board formed a committee to create an exhibit about Lynnwood's demonstration farm for the senior center.

50. COUNCIL LIAISON REPORT

Councilmember Boyer gave a summary of current City Council activities which included working on the 2017-18 budget, zoning changes and the PARC Plan.

60. STAFF REPORT

- CPC Wong reported there is a new Korean American artist exhibit on display in the City Hall's walkway to Council Chamber and the Edmonds Community College student exhibit is on display in City Hall's lobby.
- CPC Wong reported that the Sister City reception went very well and that the City received a decorative fan as a gift from the Sister City, Damyang.
- CPC Wong announced Com. Moore will not be renewing her term as a commissioner.
- CPC Wong invited the commissioners to November 3rd "For the Love of Lynnwood" workshop. Com. Lunsford motioned that the "For the Love of Lynnwood" workshop on November 3rd, 2016 be a special meeting; Com. Richards seconded and the motion unanimously carried.

80.1 2017 Art Exhibits - schedule / committee

The commissioners commended CPC Wong for his work promoting the call for artists since the number of applicants received was significantly more than in previous years.

With the increase of the applicants for the Youth Art Exhibit, the commission decided to feature multiple artists in each exhibit so each youth applicant had the opportunity to display their work. The commission suggested having collaborative art projects for the Youth Art Exhibits rather than having individual artist's exhibits for 2018.

The commission agreed that the current schedule of 6 exhibits in City Hall and 12 youth art exhibit in the recreation is sufficient but are open to adding more. Com. Hanson offered her time to install more exhibits to help create more opportunities for artists. The commission agreed to let CPC Wong schedule as many exhibits that he thinks is appropriate and has the time to curate.

80.2 Jury of 2017 Art Exhibits –

The commission reviewed the artists' applications and each commissioner discussed which artwork stood out for them. The commissioners agreed to a short list of applicants they would like for the 2017 Art Exhibits.

80.3 Updates: Signal Box wraps

CPC Wong gave an update on the plan to wrap the signal box near the interurban trail at 40th and Alderwood Mall Blvd. He told the commission the plan is to have historical pictures of the interurban car on one side of the box and the other side to have artwork inspired by the most common current activity on the interurban, biking. He then showed the commission a few historical interurban pictures and few examples of bicycle themed artwork.
