30. APPROVAL OF MINUTES –

C Richards moved; C van den Bosch seconded; June 19th minutes unanimously approved as submitted. C Richards suggested that the images presented in the meetings be accessible in case anyone absent could keep up.

40. COMMISSIONER & AD HOC REPORTS

C van den Bosch offered tickets to Seattle Art Fair in August to Arts Commission. C Gutcheck reported attending the Korean lunch also attended by CPC Wong, great meeting and good food served. C Hanson talked about ICON Juried show at Lynn Hanson Gallery and invited people to apply. C Lunsford attended JHP in Shoreline, which was inspiring.

CM Ross talked about “Meet Me in the Park” at South Lynnwood Park.

60. STAFF REPORT

See CPC Wong’s written report. He requested volunteers to introduce the plays at Shakespeare in the Park. He also reported that Eggs-plore auction earned \$1875, \$1836 after credit card fees. Human Services Commission will decide how to spend the proceeds.

80. BUSINESS ITEMS

80.1 Wine Walk

We are working with Lynnwood Convention Center and David Leclair to find an early 2019 date. C Gutcheck is going to be the contact and CPC Wong will be the back up. This will be food and wine. We plan to have launch at the Fair on 44th.

80.2 Iconic sculpture

Convention Center (LCC) approached city to collaborate on an art project at their site near corner of 36<sup>th</sup> and 196<sup>th</sup>, that will also serve as car barrier to protect the Center’s wall of

glass. Staff proposed the iconic “I Love Lynnwood” art sign that is partially funded by the gift from the Elizabeth Ruth Wallace Living Trust. Sara Blayne from LCC likes the idea, and will discuss with LPFD’s Grant Dull, and may eventually brief the LPFD board. CPC Wong showed some similar signs from around the world. Other site ideas for the Iconic Sculpture could be the Alderwood Mall or Costco area. C Richards suggested a modular sculpture that could be moved around and evolve.

#### 80.3 LOVE Lynnwood Projects / empowering co-creators

- T-shirt
- Artist Survey (Prize, Studio Tour, Art & Business workshops)

T shirts are available for sale at Rec Center for \$10. Logo from artist was selected by popular vote at the end of last year.

CPC Wong proposed conducting a survey of creatives in Lynnwood, to gauge how we can help them succeed, what they need, like work space, exhibit space, grants, technical assistance, workshops, etc. He suggested awarding \$500 to get creatives to fill out the survey, and to suggest an idea for art in public.

C Lunsford suggested doing artist booths/demos at wine walk, CPC Wong said to keep it simple this year.

C White suggested that the Fair on 44th is what brings people to Lynnwood right now, and we can feature local artists like a “get to know local artists” area. C van den Bosch agreed to make a little library at the Fair at 44th.

We also need to thank City Council for Eggs-plore. It would be good to speak for 5 minutes for why it was good. We need to share what we are doing to let them know we are working on good ideas.

#### 80.4 Traffic Signal Box – wrap (new projects)

CPC Wong showed the new mock up of the library wrap. In print shop now. Will be installed by the library.

Next box will be the Korean sister city box. One side bamboo and the other side old growth trees. Korean poem on one side and a quote by John Muir on the other. Suggestion to scratch the window idea (save it for another wrap) and blow the images larger with no window. Blend the two images where they meet on the side. Poems wrapped around the whole box.

DD Olson had idea to ask the public to submit high school photos for the big hair and blue eye shadow idea.

#### 80.5 Summer events – participation (Temp Tats)

C White suggested the idea for temporary tattoos for the art commission to hand out at Fair on 44<sup>th</sup>. C van den Bosch suggested Lynnwood Creates with symbol and also promote the Lynnwood Arts Commission. Commissioners will send CPC Wong visual ideas. C Lunsford said pop up popsicle stands will be popping up in the summer that we could pass out tattoos. Also on Aug 11- History and Heritage Day.

#### 80.6 Bus Wrap

The estimate to wrap the van was high, and together with body work needed before the wrap is even feasible, will cost \$20,000. We'll cancel this wrap and decide on another idea.

80.7 South Lynnwood Park – Placemaking (Mural)

Back wall of the restroom building at South Lynnwood Park is great for murals or movie screen. CPC Wong is in discussion with Marketing Agency C+C to create a mural with Spanish speaking community about recycling. C van den Bosch suggested tagging might be a problem. Have a color code for matching for repairs. Also have a maintenance budget.
