ORDINANCE NO. 2990

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF LYNNWOOD, WASHINGTON, PROVIDING FOR SUBMISSION OF A PROPOSITION TO THE QUALIFIED VOTERS OF THE CITY OF LYNNWOOD AT THE NOVEMBER 2013 ELECTION, THAT WOULD PERMIT THE CITY TO LEVY THE PREVIOUSLY AUTHORIZED EMERGENCY SERVICES PROPERTY TAX LEVY RATE OF \$0.50 PER \$1000 ASSESSED VALUE FOR COLLECTION IN 2014 THROUGH 2023 AS PERMITTED BY LAW; SETTING FORTH THE BALLOT PROPOSITION; AND DIRECTING THE CITY FINANCE DIRECTOR TO PROVIDE THE COUNTY AUDITOR WITH A CERTIFIED COPY OF THIS ORDINANCE.

WHEREAS, in RCW 84.52.069, the Washington State Legislature authorized cities to impose an additional property tax levy of up to \$.50 per One Thousand Dollars of assessed valuation to provide emergency medical care and emergency medical services in each year for ten consecutive years; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with RCW 84.52.069, in November 2001, voters of the City of Lynnwood approved a ten year Emergency Medical Services tax levy of up to \$.50 per One Thousand Dollars assessed valuation to provide emergency medical care and emergency medical services, to apply in the years 2002 through 2012; and

WHEREAS, in September 2006, voters again approved a ten year Emergency Medical Services tax levy of up to \$.50 per One Thousand Dollars assessed valuation to provide emergency medical care and emergency medical services, to apply in the years 2007 through 2016; and

WHEREAS, the voters' action in 2006 had the effect of starting over, resetting and restoring the ten year Emergency Medical Services tax levy of up to \$.50 per One Thousand Dollars assessed valuation, as if the Emergency Medical Services tax levy had been approved for the first time; and

WHEREAS, in November 2009, voters again approved a ten year Emergency Medical Services tax levy of up to \$.50 per One Thousand Dollars assessed valuation to provide

emergency medical care and emergency medical services, to apply in the years 2010 through 2019; and

WHEREAS, Snohomish County interpreted the voters' action in 2009 as a "levy lid lift," and not as having the effect of starting over and resetting the ten year Emergency Medical Services tax levy; and

WHEREAS, the City of Lynnwood continues to maintain a full-time fire department which provides emergency medical services that includes paramedic response and transport services; and

WHEREAS, assuring a constant and stable source of funds to provide such emergency medical care and services will ensure continuous provision of emergency medical care and services and so is in the best interest of the public health, safety and general welfare; and

WHEREAS, the level of funding needed to provide adequate emergency medical care and services to the citizens of the City of Lynnwood for each of the years 2014 through 2023 cannot be precisely determined due to the changing economic needs and demands of the City; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with RCW 84.52.069, the Lynnwood City Council has determined that it is in the best interests of the City to conduct another election on the issue of whether to approve a new ten year Emergency Medical Services tax levy of up to the full \$.50 per One Thousand Dollars assessed valuation authorized by law to provide emergency medical care and emergency medical services, to apply in the years 2014 through 2023;

WHEREAS, it is the Lynnwood City Council's intent that if the voters approve this proposition, the effect will be to start over, reset and restore the ten year Emergency Medical Services tax levy of up to \$.50 per One Thousand Dollars assessed valuation, as if the Emergency Medical Services tax levy was approved for the first time (and not as a "levy lid lift"); now, therefore

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LYNNWOOD, WASHINGTON, DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Snohomish County Auditor, as the *ex officio* supervisor of elections, is requested to call and conduct an election in the City of Lynnwood, Snohomish County, Washington, in the manner provided by law, to be held on November 5, 2013 in conjunction with the general election to be held on the same day, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified electors of the City for their approval or rejection the question of whether or not to permit the City of Lynnwood to increase the property tax levy to the authorized rate of \$0.50 per One Thousand dollars of assessed valuation, commencing in

2014, and to be assessed in each of the years 2014 through 2023 and to be collected in the years 2014 through 2023, the dollar amount of said subsequent levies to be determined by the amount of funds needed to adequately provide for emergency medical care and services, limited by RCW 84.52 and not to exceed \$0.50 per One Thousand Dollars of the then current assessed valuation of all property in the City subject to taxation, said levies to be in addition to the regular tax levy provided by law for cities without the vote of the electors, with the proceeds of said tax levy to be used to pay the costs of providing emergency medical care and emergency medical services, including related personnel costs, training for such personnel, and related equipment, supplies, vehicles, and structures needed for the provision of emergency medical care and emergency medical services.

Section 2. The ballot title and proposition to be submitted to the voters shall be in substantially the following form:

Proposition 1

For the purpose of continuing to fund emergency medical care and emergency medical and paramedic services, shall the City of Lynnwood be authorized to impose an additional regular property tax levy at the rate of \$0.50 or less per One Thousand Dollars of assessed valuation within the City, for each of the years 2014 through 2023?

Section 3. The Finance Director and the City Attorney are authorized to make such minor adjustments to the wording of the proposition as may be recommended or required by the Snohomish County Auditor, as long as the intent of the proposition remains clear and as approved by the City Council.

Section 4. If the qualified voters voting on the proposition approve the adoption thereof in accordance with law, the proposition shall be adopted and thereafter the City Council shall have the necessary authority to levy, in the manner provided by law, a regular property tax emergency medical services levy in an amount of \$0.50 per \$1,000 in assessed value for collection in each of the years 2014 through 2023 as permitted by law. If the qualified voters voting on the proposition do not approve the proposition, then it shall be deemed rejected and the City Council shall not increase the currently existing EMS levy above the levy limits set forth in RCW 84.55. The City's authority to levy the existing, and previously approved, EMS levy shall in no way be affected by the rejection of the proposition authorized in this ordinance.

Section 5. The proposition, if approved, shall authorize the City Council to levy the regular property tax emergency medical services levy in the full amount of \$0.50 per \$1,000 in assessed value for collection in each of the years 2014 through 2023 as permitted

by law, and the City Council shall no longer levy an EMS levy under the authority of the proposition approved by the voters in 2009.

Section 6. The Finance Director is hereby authorized and directed to furnish to the Snohomish County Auditor a certified copy of this Ordinance on or before August 6, 2013.

Section 7. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this Ordinance should be held to be invalid or unconstitutional or inapplicable by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality or inapplicability thereof shall not affect the validity or constitutionality of any other section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this Ordinance.

Section 8. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effective five (5) days after passage and publication as provided by law. Publication shall be by summary publication of the Ordinance Title.




