



ORDINANCE NO. 2994

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF LYNNWOOD, WASHINGTON, ESTABLISHING PROJECT FUNDING FOR THE LIFT STATION 10 WET WELL MODIFICATIONS 2013; AND AUTHORIZING EXPENDITURES IN UTILITY FUND 411; AND CONSISTENT WITH THE PROJECT FINANCIAL PLAN; AND PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY, AN EFFECTIVE DATE AND SUMMARY PUBLICATION.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Chapter 35A.33 RCW, the City of Lynnwood is required to appropriate funds for City projects and to formally authorize the transfer of appropriations from one fund to another fund; and

WHEREAS, the City of Lynnwood's Lift Station 10 was constructed in 1992; and

WHEREAS, the City of Lynnwood's Lift Station 10 is experiencing the effects of severe metal corrosion; and

WHEREAS, the Lift Station 10 receives a high volume of grease and other debris; and

WHEREAS, the design and construction of improvements to correct said deficiencies will extend the useful life of the facility; and

WHEREAS, the anticipated funding for the project will be under Utility Fund 411, of which the proposed improvements to be completed by the Project are eligible expenses; now therefore,

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LYNNWOOD, WASHINGTON, DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Appropriation:
