ORDINANCE NO. 3180

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF LYNNWOOD, WASHINGTON, SUPERSEDING ORDINANCE 3156, ESTABLISHING PROJECT FUNDING FOR THE SEWER IMPROVEMENTS RELATED TO LIFT STATIONS #4 AND #8; AND AUTHORIZING EXPENDITURES IN UTILITY FUND 411; AND CONSISTENT WITH THE PROJECT FINANCIAL PLAN; AND PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY, AN EFFECTIVE DATE AND SUMMARY PUBLICATION.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Chapter 35A.33 RCW, the City of Lynnwood is required to appropriate funds for City projects and to formally authorize the transfer of appropriations from one fund to another fund; and

WHEREAS, sewer infrastructure in the Alderwood Mall South Area, including sewer Lift Station #8, was constructed in the late-1960's; and

WHEREAS, sewer infrastructure in the Alderwood Mall North Area, including sewer Lift Station #4, was constructed in the mid-1980's; and

WHEREAS, based on population and employment growth anticipated in the Lift Station #4 and #8 sewer drainage basins, additional sewer capacity is needed to accommodate this growth; and

WHEREAS, the Project will complete some of these sewer capacity improvements including installation of new gravity and force main pipe infrastructure between Lift Stations #4 and #8 and also between Lift Stations #8 and #10; and

WHEREAS, the anticipated funding for the Project will be under Utility Fund 411, of which the proposed improvements to be completed by the Project are eligible expenses; and

WHEREAS, the City has previously approved a Project financial plan in Ordinance 3156;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LYNNWOOD, WASHINGTON, DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

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
44 Section 2. Modifications of the 2015-2016 Biennial Budget. The required expenditures for
