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ORDINANCE NO. 3189

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LYNNWOOD, WASHINGTON, RELATING TO LICENSING AND REGULATION OF BUSINESSES, ADDING A NEW SECTION LMC 5.04.010, AMENDING LMC 3.104.010, LMC 5.04.020, LMC 5.04.030, LMC 5.04.040, LMC 5.04.045 AND LMC 5.06.010, RECODIFYING LMC 5.04.090, REPEALING LMC 5.04.042 AND LMC 5.04.050, AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE, SEVERABILITY AND SUMMARY PUBLICATION

WHEREAS, Title 5 of the Lynnwood Municipal Code (LMC) consists of regulations relating to businesses and business licensing; and

WHEREAS, many of the provisions of Title 5 LMC were enacted in 1959 as part of the City's first municipal code and 57 years later, no longer provide effective and efficient provisions regarding businesses and the licensing of businesses; and

WHEREAS, many of the provisions of the Fee Schedule, codified as LMC 3.104.010, were enacted many years ago and no longer provide effective and efficient provisions regarding businesses and the licensing of businesses; and

WHEREAS, in order to protect the public's health, safety and welfare, it is appropriate and necessary that Lynnwood regulate business activity and utilize business licensing as a means to confirm adherence to applicable regulations; and

WHEREAS, businesses are a vital component of the community and produce important tangible and intangible benefits by operating within Lynnwood, and the extent of regulatory controls should not exceed those necessary to protect the public's health, safety and welfare; and

WHEREAS, using LEAN principles, an inter-departmental workgroup of City employees identified numerous regulatory and procedural improvements that will eliminate waste, promote understanding of City regulations and licensing requirements, and normalize business regulations that have become ineffectual due to the passage of time; and

1 WHEREAS, the provisions of this ordinance address a portion of the regulatory and
2 procedural improvements identified by the LEAN workgroup, and subsequent legislation will
3 address remaining matters so that the Fee Schedule and Title 5 LMC can appropriately and
4 effectively regulate business activity; and

5 WHEREAS, as the provisions of this ordinance do not relate to comprehensive plans or
6 development regulations, and therefore notification of State agencies as specified by RCW
7 36.70A.106 and WAC 365-196-630 is not required; and

8 WHEREAS, the provisions of this ordinance are procedural in nature and are exempt
9 from SEPA threshold determination and EIS requirements as specified by to WAC 197-11-
10 800(19); and

11 WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that the provisions of this ordinance are in
12 the interest of the public's health, safety and general welfare;

13 **NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LYNNWOOD, WASHINGTON, DO**
14 **ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:**

15 **Section 1:** The portion of Table 3.104.010 entitled, "TITLE 5-BUSINESS REGULATIONS AND
16 LICENSE FEES" in LMC 3.104.010 is amended as provided by Exhibit A to this ordinance.

17 **Section 2:** A new section is added to Chapter 5.04 LMC to read as follows:

18 **5.04.010 Administrative authority**

19 **A.** Except as specified herein, the finance director is authorized to administer, interpret,
20 and enforce the provisions of this title. The finance director may promulgate forms, policies,
21 and procedures as necessary to effectively and uniformly administer these provisions.

22 **B.** As necessary, the director may designate employees of the finance department or
23 other city department to implement or enforce the provisions of this title. Enforcement of this
24 title shall be based upon the authority and regulations set out in this chapter and in Chapters
25 1.01 and 1.40 LMC.

26 **Section 3:** LMC 5.04.020 is amended to read as follows:

27 **5.04.020 License to conduct business and compliance with applicable law.**

28 **A.** It is unlawful for any person, firm, corporation or association to maintain, conduct or
29 operate any device, vehicle or thing, or engage in any business, profession, trade, occupation or
30 activity without first having secured the license to do so, and paying all fees prescribed in this
31 code.

32 **B.** Businesses licensed by the City, the licensee, and business employees shall conduct
33 business operations and activities in compliance with applicable federal, state, and local laws
34 and regulations.

1 C. The physical premises of a business licensed by the City shall conform to all
2 applicable laws and regulations for property and structures, including but not limited to laws
3 and regulations relating to land use, building, fire, health and safety, environment, and
4 nuisances.

5 D. In instances when ownership of a licensed business is transferred, or when a licensed
6 business is moved to a new physical location, a new business license shall be required. It shall
7 be the responsibility of the business owner to submit a complete application for a business
8 license. The business may be granted a 30-business-day grace period to allow for continuity of
9 business operations while the new business license application is reviewed by the city.

10 E. In instances when the name of the business is changed without the need for a change
11 to the business' Uniform Business Identifier (UBI) as determined by the Washington State
12 Department of Revenue, and without a change in business ownership or location, the business
13 owner shall notify the city of the name change not less than 15 business days ~~((ef))~~ prior to the
14 change.

15 **Section 4:** LMC 5.04.030 is amended to read as follows:

16 **5.04.030 Application for license –Decision of the Director – Appeal.**

17 A. No license required under this chapter shall be issued except upon application made
18 on forms prescribed by the city. Each application for license, in addition to other requirements,
19 shall indicate:

20 1. The physical address and the mailing address for the proposed business or
21 occupation;

22 2. The type and nature of the proposed business or occupation which the applicant
23 intends to operate on said premises; and

24 3. The identity of the person or persons holding an ownership interest in the
25 business, and those responsible for operation of the business, such as agents and officers of
26 the corporation, business owner, or primary business manager. Telephone and email
27 contact information shall be provided for each person identified.

28 B. Each license application shall be accompanied by the license fee specified by Chapter
29 3.104 LMC.

30 C. Upon review of a complete application for a business license, the director shall take
31 one of the following actions:

32 1. Approve the application; or

33 2. Approve the application with conditions necessary to ensure compliance with this
34 Title; or

1 3. Request additional information regarding the type and nature of the proposed
2 business, or the responsible persons; or

3 4. Deny the application as provided by this section.

4 D. In the event the director denies a business license application, the director shall
5 provide a written explanation of the reason for the denial to the applicant, with information
6 regarding the right of appeal. The director may deny a business license application for reasons
7 including but not limited to:

8 1. If the applicant fails to submit a complete application or additional information
9 requested by the Director;

10 2. If the application represents business practices that would cause any person to
11 violate any federal, state or local law or regulation;

12 3. If the application contains misleading or inaccurate information;

13 4. If the applicant, corporate officer, or other responsible party has previously had
14 his/her business license denied or revoked in Lynnwood or elsewhere, or has been
15 convicted of, forfeited bonds for, or has plead guilty to offenses related to the operation of
16 the same or a substantially similar business in Lynnwood or elsewhere, and the Director has
17 reliable, objective information that approval of the application will result in unlawful
18 business activity; or

19 5. If violation(s) of building, zoning, safety, fire or health regulations exist on the
20 premises of the proposed business, after receiving instruction from the city or other
21 regulatory agency to correct such violation(s).

22 E. Following the director's approval of the application, the business license shall be
23 issued by the city.

24 F. Upon denial of an application for a business license, the Base Fee for Business
25 Employees specified by Chapter 3.104 LMC shall be returned to the applicant with the denial
26 decision.

27 G. An applicant denied a license, or any person objecting to the issuance of a license
28 may appeal the director's decision by filing a written notice of appeal with the city clerk. The
29 appeal must be filed within 10 business days of the director's decision, include the appeal fee
30 specified by chapter 3.104 LMC, and state the factual grounds for the appeal. The hearing
31 examiner shall set a date for the appeal hearing. The city clerk shall notify the parties of record
32 by mail of the time and place of the hearing, which shall be conducted as specified by LMC
33 1.35.200 et. seq., Chapter 2.22 LMC and the rules for hearings adopted pursuant to LMC
34 2.22.080.

1 **Section 5.** LMC 5.04.040 is amended to read as follows:

2 **5.04.040 Term and renewal of license.**

3 A. Except where a different term is specified or authorized by this Title, business
4 licenses shall have a term of one year (365 days).

5 B. Unless an alternative term is specified by the Director, the term of a new license shall
6 commence on the date of issuance of the license, and the term of a renewed license shall
7 commence on the day following the expiration of the existing license. Licenses issued by the
8 Director shall specify the dates of the term of the license.

9 C. A short-term, non-resident business license may be issued for a term of 60
10 consecutive days.

11 D. Within 45 days before or after the expiration of the license's term, the applicant may
12 submit a complete application for renewal of the license, for a subsequent one-year term. Each
13 license renewal application shall be on form prescribed by the city, and shall be accompanied
14 by the fee(s) specified by Chapter 3.104 LMC. For applications submitted after the expiration of
15 the license's term, the late business license application fee specified by Chapter 3.104 LMC shall
16 apply. Upon review of a complete license renewal application, the director shall take one of the
17 following actions:

- 18 1. Approve the application;
- 19 2. Approve the application with conditions necessary to ensure compliance with this
20 Title;
- 21 3. Request additional information regarding the type and nature of the proposed
22 business, or the responsible persons; or
- 23 4. Deny the application as provided by this section.

24 E. In the event the director denies a license renewal application, the director shall
25 provide a written explanation of the reason for the denial to the applicant, with information
26 regarding the right of appeal. The director may deny a business license application for reasons
27 including but not limited to the reasons stated in LMC 5.04.030 for denial of an initial license
28 application.

29 F. If an application for license renewal is not made as allowed by this section, an
30 application for a new license shall be required. The late business license application fee
31 specified by Chapter 3.104 LMC shall apply.

32 G. If a license expires prior to the submittal of a complete and good-faith application for
33 renewal, the business shall be considered to be in violation of the provisions of this Title.

1 Submittal of a complete application for license renewal to the City within the timeframes
2 allowed by this section may suspend further enforcement and/or the imposition of penalty.

3 **Section 6:** LMC 5.04.042 is repealed.

4 **Section 7:** LMC 5.04.045 is amended to read as follows:

5 **5.04.045 Revocation or suspension of business license.**

6 A. The director may revoke or suspend a business license when the business operation,
7 or the licensee meets the criteria for denial of a business license application specified by LMC
8 5.04.030.

9 B. Upon a determination by the director that there is a basis for revocation or
10 suspension of a business license, the director shall notify the licensee by certified and regular
11 mail of the director's decision to revoke or suspend the license. The written decision shall
12 specify the basis for the director's determination, the effective date of the revocation or
13 suspension, the corrective measures required to avoid revocation or suspension, and the
14 procedures for appeal of the director's determination.

15 C. The decision of the director may be appealed by filing a written appeal with the city
16 clerk within 10 business days of the date of the written decision, together with the appeal fee
17 specified by chapter 3.104 LMC. An appeal of the director's decision shall be conducted by the
18 hearing examiner consistent with the provisions of LMC 5.04.030, LMC 1.35.200 et seq.,
19 Chapter 2.22 LMC, and the rules for hearings adopted pursuant to LMC 2.22.080. Upon the
20 filing of a timely appeal, the director's decision to revoke or suspend the business license shall
21 be stayed pending a final decision by the hearing examiner on the appeal.

22 **Section 8:** LMC 5.04.050 is repealed.

23 **Section 9.** LMC 5.06.010 is amended to read as follows:

24 **5.06.010 Definitions.**

25 The following definitions shall apply in construing the provisions of this chapter, except where
26 otherwise declared or clearly apparent from the context:

27 A. "Home occupation" means the operation from a dwelling of a business which is
28 clearly incidental to the primary use of the dwelling as living quarters and which in no manner
29 compromises the residential character of the neighborhood in which the dwelling is located.

30 B. "Nonresident business" means and includes any business conducted in the city from
31 an office outside of the city, not occupying a fixed place of operation within the city of
32 Lynnwood, but which business performs work or carries on business within the city of
33 Lynnwood.

1 C. "Resident business" means and includes a business occupying a fixed place of
2 operations within the city of Lynnwood and not specifically included in nonresident or home
3 occupation classification.

4 D. "Business," whether resident, nonresident or home occupation, means and includes
5 all services and activities engaged in with the object of pecuniary gain, benefit or advantage to
6 the persons, or to another person or class, directly or indirectly, whether part-time or full-time.
7 For the purposes of this chapter, the following shall not be considered to be a business:

8 1. Businesses or activities for which licenses or franchises are required by any
9 other chapter or section of the Lynnwood Municipal Code.

10 2. Nonbusiness activities carried on by a religious, charitable, benevolent,
11 fraternal or social organization including:

12 a. Nonprofit, Section 501(c)(3) organizations as designated by the
13 Internal Revenue Service.

14 b. Political, Section 527 organizations as designated by the Internal
15 Revenue Service.

16 3. Instructors providing public education and recreation services on behalf of a
17 government agency.

18 4. Insurance producers as defined by RCW 48.17.010.

19 E. "Employee" means and includes any individual person employed at any business
20 enterprise who performs any part of his duties within the city, except casual laborers not
21 employed in the usual course of business. A sole proprietor is not an "employee." All officers,
22 agents, dealers, franchisees, etc., of a corporation or business trust, and all but one partner of a
23 partnership (except limited partners), are "employees" within this definition.

24 F. "Engaging or engage in business" means commencing, conducting or continuing in
25 any business.

26 G. "Flea market" means and includes any person, firm or corporation, or company
27 subleasing booths, stalls or tables within a building located within the limits of the city of
28 Lynnwood for the purpose of placing before the public for sale, on a temporary basis, used
29 goods, new wares or merchandise, with the exception of secondhand items subject to Chapter
30 5.82 LMC regulating secondhand dealers.

31 **Section 10: Codification.** LMC 5.04.090 is recodified as LMC 5.04.002.


32 **Section 11: Effective Date of Amendment and Adoption.** This ordinance shall become effective
33 five days following passage and publication of this ordinance.

1 **Section 12: Severability.** If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or word of this
2 ordinance should be held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction,
3 such invalidity or unconstitutionality thereof shall not affect the validity or constitutionality of
4 any other section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or word of this ordinance.

5 **Section 13: Summary Publication.** Publication of this ordinance shall be by summary
6 publication consisting of the ordinance title.

ORDINANCE NO. 3188
