
Question #1: For the public art appraisal, services can be provided to the City in varying degrees of complexity and depth. Is the City interested in an insurance-level, replacement valuation of the collection or a fair market value of the collection that requires more in-depth research and interviews with artists?

Answer: For the purposes of this appraisal, we are looking for the fair market value of the collection. 58 pieces of the collection were documented and appraised in 1999 (see Exhibit A – Art Appraisal Example). The process for determining fair-market value should be determined by the appraiser. The portion of the collection that may require artist interviews to complete the appraisal is expected to be less than 15% of the total collection.
