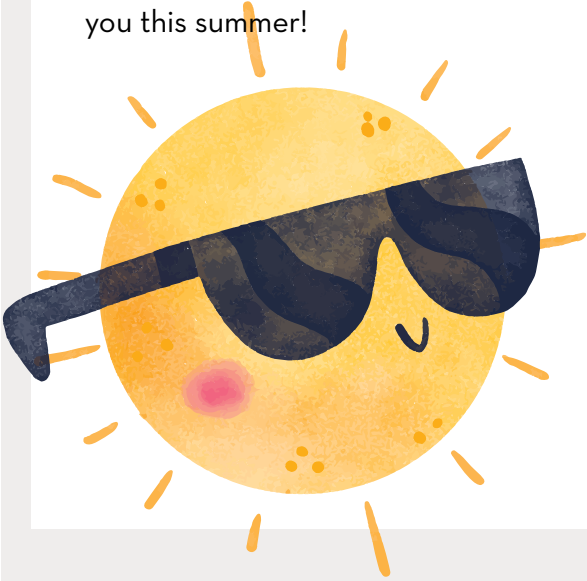

Cool summer tips from your



- If you have AC, turn your thermostat up to 78° when you're home and 84° when you're not. You can save 3-5% in home cooling costs for every degree you raise it.
- Closing your blinds, shades or curtains on warm days keeps the sun's rays out and helps keep your home cool.
- Use a crock pot, toaster oven or microwave to cook meals instead of your full-sized range or oven to keep your home cooler and save energy. Better yet, fire up the grill and take meal prep outside.
- Check to be sure air vents or window AC units aren't blocked by furniture, vacuum the unit or have vents cleaned, and make sure the air filter is clean.
- Install a smart thermostat.

Council Corner Lynnwood Voters Now Have Opportunity to Select Future Municipal Court Judge

Since 1989, a part-time judge, appointed by the Lynnwood City Council, has presided over the court since its inception. In March 2023, the Lynnwood City Council unanimously approved an action changing Lynnwood’s Municipal Court Judge from a part-time appointed position to a full-time elected judge. Because of this change, Lynnwood residents will have the opportunity to vote on who should serve as Lynnwood’s next Municipal Court Judge later this year.

The Community Justice Center, which is currently under construction, includes two courtrooms, creating the possibility of a Community Court. A Community Court is an alternative problem-solving court that seeks to address underlying challenges that some court participants have that may inhibit their ability to break free of the criminal justice cycle successfully. With a full-time elected judge, a Community Court is possible.

The City of Lynnwood is filing the Municipal Court Judge position with the Snohomish County Elections

Office, and any interested candidates may file for the office during candidate filing. This position will ultimately be voted on by the registered voters of the City of Lynnwood during the August Primary Election and the November General Election. After the election is certified, the newly elected Municipal Court Judge will take the bench on January 1, 2024.

Lynnwood’s next Municipal Court Judge must be a resident of Washington State and live in Snohomish County, and they must be an attorney in good standing.

LYNNWOOD COMPREHENSIVE PLAN 2024

The **2024 Comprehensive Plan Update** will plan for Lynnwood's next 20 years. A Comprehensive Plan envisions a city's future. It describes a city's long-term vision for growth, infrastructure, and services. It articulates a series of goals and policies intended to guide the day-to-day decisions of elected officials and staff. Part of the Comprehensive Plan Update work includes incorporating the future of our Regional Growth Center into the vision of the City.



City Center + Alderwood Plan will establish a vision and set of goals and policies for the City Center and Alderwood Mall areas. By 2037, this area will have two light rail stations and is expected to see significant redevelopment that will support new jobs and housing and create unique community gathering places.

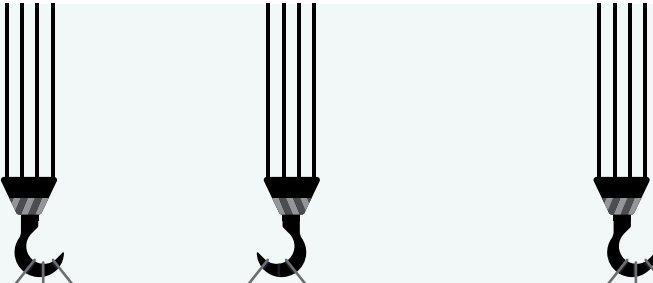

Scriber Creek Trail Phase 2

By the end of May, most of the work on 200th St SW will conclude including the installation of new water main and storm sewer, boardwalk 1 along the road, and sidewalk. The work at the intersection of 200th St SW and Cedar Valley Road will continue as we wait for the shipment of the new signal poles and signal cabinet. Crews will be preparing to work on boardwalks 2 and 3 in Scriber Creek Park with work in the wetland to begin in July.

196th Street Improvement

Property restoration along the 196th Street Improvement project is underway. The median has been planted, and the final touches are in progress. We have been asked, "Why has a median been put in?" Medians have been found to improve safety by encouraging reduced speeds, increasing predictability for people driving, and serving as a pedestrian refuge at crosswalks. We have worked with a team of experts, including arborists, landscapers, and geotechnical engineers, to build the planted median. Special considerations were made based on underground utilities, tree species, planting strip width, and resiliency to weather and climate.
