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### **ORDINANCE NO. 3238**

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF LYNNWOOD, WASHINGTON,

ADOPTING A TWO YEAR BIENNIUM BUDGET FOR THE CITY OF

LYNNWOOD, WASHINGTON, FOR THE YEARS ENDING DECEMBER

31, 2017 AND 2018; TRANSMITTING BUDGET COPIES TO THE

STATE; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE, SEVERABILITY.

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AND SUMMARY PUBLICATION. WHEREAS, in accordance with Chapter 35A.34 RCW, the Mayor of the City of Lynnwood, Washington, did make, and file with the Finance Director of the City of Lynnwood a preliminary

biennial budget and estimate of the amount of monies required to meet the public expenses, bond retirement, interest and expenses of government of said City for the fiscal years ending December 31, 2017 and 2018; and

WHEREAS, the Lynnwood City Council is charged by RCW 35A.34.120 to make such adjustments and changes as it deems necessary or proper, and after determining the allowance in each item, department, classification and fund, to adopt a budget for fiscal years 2017 and 2018; and

WHEREAS, following public notice in accordance with applicable law, public hearings were held before the City Council on November 14, 2016 and November 28, 2016, for the purpose of receiving public comment on the preliminary budget for 2017-2018, and all persons wishing to be heard were heard; and

WHEREAS, as provided in state law Chapter 35A.34 RCW, the City Council did determine and fix the ad valorem taxes to be levied for 2017 on November 28, 2016; and

WHEREAS, the said proposed biennial budget does not exceed the lawful limit of taxation allowed by law to be levied on the property of the City of Lynnwood for the purposes set forth in the budget, and estimated expenditures set forth in the budget being all necessary to carry on the government of the said City during said period;

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LYNNWOOD, WASHINGTON, DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Department and Fund Appropriations. The required expenditures for operation of Section 1. the various departments and funds of the City of Lynnwood, for the fiscal years ending December 31, 2017 and 2018, are approved as provided by Exhibit A to this Ordinance.

Severability. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or word of this Ordinance should be held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality thereof shall not affect the validity or constitutionality of any other section, sentence, clause, phrase or word of this Ordinance. Section 3. Effective Date and Summary Publication. This ordinance, being an exercise of a power specifically delegated to the City legislative body, is not subject to referendum and shall take effect and be in full force five (5) days after its passage, approval, and publication of an approved summary thereof consisting of the title.
