Briefing - House Bill 1590

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- Council President Frizzell shared that House Bill 1590 was passed, allowing the 0.1% local sales and use tax for Affordable Housing to be imposed by a Councilmanic Authority. She introduced Chris Collier, Alliance for Housing Affordability (AHA) Program Manager, who shared more detail on the bill and the city's options.
- The council decided they would like to talk with representative Lauren Davis to understand her perspective as she was one of the original makers of the bill.

Discussion – Preliminary Budget for 2021-2022 and 2021 Property Tax Levy (1:05:00)

- EDIF: Strategic planner Loch reviewed options for the council to consider as plans to replenish the Revenue Stabilization fund and whether to use the Economic Development Infrastructure Fund (EDIF). Council members asked questions and made comments. It was decided to ask the finance committee for their recommendation after reviewing all options more closely. Director Kleitsch will send the resolution that created the EDIF Fund.
- **Biennium Budget:** Council members continued discussion about the proposed budget and Tax Levy with Finance Director Sonja Springer. Council members asked questions and made comments.

Discussion – Should Marijuana Retail Stores be Allowed in the City of Lynnwood? (1:47:00)

• Council member Hurst introduced Josh Estes from Pacific Northwest Regional Strategies who presented the benefits of having marijuana retail stores in the community. Council members gave

comments on the presentation and decided to have further discussion about this subject after learning more from the Health District and Police.

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Motion made by Council President Frizzell and seconded by Council Member Cotton, to extend the meeting to 9:15 pm. Motion passed unanimously. (2:58:00)

- Mayor Smith announced that Congressman Larson's office was excited about the ungrounding of
