HOW TO DETERMINE WHETHER A PROJECT REQUIRES IMPACT FEES

1.	 Does the project generate new P.M. Peak Hour trips? Projects which generally do not generate new trips include: a. Miscellaneous improvements such as fences, walls, residential swimming pools, and signs; b. Demolition or moving of a structure; or c. A change of use, rezones, Comprehensive Plan amendments, subdivisions, boundary line adjustments, lot combinations, or any other land use permits and miscellaneous permits for activities.
