Regional Fire Service

At the time of publication, the August 1st election results were not yet certified, however it appears as though voters in Lynnwood and Snohomish County Fire District 1 have approved the creation and funding of the South Snohomish County Fire and Rescue (SSCFR) Regional Fire Authority. The new SSCFR will consolidate and standardize resources and provide sustainable and stable funding for fire and emergency medical services. Together, Lynnwood and FD1 will now move ahead with the work of establishing the SSCFR, which will assume service responsibility effective October 1, 2017. Existing fire personnel and equipment will be transferred over to SSCFR and residents can expect a seamless service transition.

Rain Gardens

In June, the City of Lynnwood partnered with the Snohomish Conservation District, Washington State University Master Gardeners, and Edmonds Community College to install 6 rain gardens, 13 catchment systems, and 52 rain barrels within the Perrinville Watershed.

A rain garden is a depression created in your landscape to allow rainwater from your roof or driveway to slowly soak into the ground instead of running off into the nearest stream or Puget Sound. Native soils are removed and replaced with a special blend of high organic soil, bioretention and mulch. Rain gardens are then planted with beautiful, hardy, low-maintenance native perennial plants, which can withstand drought and wet root conditions.

The Lynnwood Rain Garden initiative is a five-year project funded through a Washington State Conservation Grant and the City of Lynnwood's tree grant program.

Snohomish County Tourism Starts in Lynnwood

Summer is almost over and with it goes the height of our tourism season. That's right, tourism season. It's a little-known fact that Lynnwood is a one of the leading destinations for tourists visiting Snohomish County and the Seattle area. With 11 hotels and a new Hilton Garden Inn under construction, Lynnwood has a robust hospitality sector that contributes significantly to the City's funds via lodging taxes, and generates almost \$50 million annually in lodging revenue. To give you a sense of scale, Lynnwood generates almost half as much in revenue as the rest of the county combined. When you consider the positive economic impact of tourist spending, tourists staying in Lynnwood contribute significantly to our economy. What does tourism look like here in Lynnwood and Snohomish County? We invite you to find out. New Options for Utility Billing Customers

Lynnwood Self Service

Now available for Utility Billing customers is the online Lynnwood Self Service where you'll be able to pay, review and reprint any



of your utility bills online. The first step is to create a self-service user ID and link it to your utility account. You will need your utility account number and customer number as it appears on any bill sent to you since January 2017. To get started, visit www.LynnwoodWA.gov, go to City Services, and click on the faucet graphic.

Once your registration is completed you will be able to obtain any information you need and to make online payments.

Low Income Family Rebate Program

This program offers a rebate of up to 50% of the base rate of City of Lynnwood Utility bills to families who qualify for the Washington State Free and Reduced Price Meal Programs for Children. Funds are limited and rebate amounts will depend upon the number of eligible applicants. This program is available to families that live within Lynnwood city limits, whether they pay for their city utilities directly or if their utilities are included in their rent. This program does not apply to residences used for business purposes.

Major Projects

There's quite a lot going on in the City of Lynnwood. There are several major commercial and residential projects currently underway, and more coming soon! Here is a snapshot of what's happening:

Hilton Garden Inn

Located behind the City Center Apartments on Alderwood Mall Blvd 150-room, 6-story hotel with structured parking. Guest amenities include pool, gym and conference facilities. Expected completion spring 2018.

Alderwood Mall Village Expansion

East side of Alderwood mall Redevelopment of former Sears location into an entertainment and restaurant village. Proposed anchor tenants include Dave & Busters and Dick's Sporting Goods. The Cheesecake Factory is also proposed adjacent to the village redevelopment. *Expected completion TBD*.

Triton Court

Northeast corner of 200th St. SW and 68th Ave. W 5-story, 104-unit student housing mixed-use building with ground floor retail/office. Expected completion TBD.

Reserve at Scriber Lake

Scriber Lake Rd. between 196th St. SW and 200th St. SW 295-unit, 5-story senior apartments. The building was about 60% complete when it was completely destroyed by a fire in January 2017. This will be reconstructed, opening date still to be determined.

Northwest Motor Sports

East side of Highway 99 at the 17300 block Sales and service buildings. Expected completion date early 2018.

Lynnwood Self Storage

Highway 99, north of 196th St. SW 5-story, 131,000 sq. ft self storage facility. Expected completion date early 2018.
