Moved by Nick Coelho; seconded by Whitney Stohr to Recommend that City Council invest between \$2 million and \$6 million of the ARPA funds in the following Parks & Recreation Board park and trail priorities, which support inclusive access to public health and health equity:

1	Meadowdale Playfields Inclusive Playground (\$400,000)
2	Scriber Lake Park Boardwalk Trail (\$1,600,000)
3	Town Square Park Acquisition (up to \$4,000,000)

MEADOWDALE PLAYFIELDS INCLUSIVE PLAYGROUND

Replace and expand the existing playground with a universally designed playground and pathway to provide a new ADA accessible playground experience.

Construction: 2022

Estimated Project Cost: \$400,000

ARPA Request: \$400,000

SCRIBER LAKE PARK BOARDWALK TRAIL

Replacement of a 40-year-old wood chipped trail through critical area. Will be replaced with an elevated boardwalk to create a 1/2 mile, ADA compliant loop trail.

Construction: 2024 – 2025

Estimate Project Cost: \$3,000,000

ARPA Request: \$1,600,000

TOWN SQUARE PARK ACQUISITION

Envisioned as our future gathering place, this approximately 2-acre park will help catalyze City Center’s transit-oriented development, supporting pedestrian-scale activity and retail, anchored by the Link light rail station.

Acquisition: 2022

Estimate Project Cost: TBD

ARPA Request: \$1,000,000 - \$4,000,000

Moved by Katie McKeown; seconded by Nick Coelho to Recommend the ARPA investment priorities of the Human Services Commission to the City Council.

Motion Passed: 6- 0

Moved by Whitney Stohr; seconded by Nick Coelho to select a board spokesperson to convey the board’s priorities to the City Council. The motion passed 6-0.
