Initial Proposal to the City of Lynnwood

Volunteers of America Western Washington (VOAWW) is grateful for the opportunity to provide the City of Lynnwood with our vision for an expansion of our Rapid Rehousing Program. Additionally, we are very excited to partner with the City to serve our most vulnerable community members.

We understand that the individuals to be served will be residents of Lynnwood and that the services provided will address the housing and mental health needs of homeless community members. We would like to propose the following:

- Homeless individuals and families within the city of Lynnwood will be referred to VOAWW through the Coordinated Entry system. Our Housing Services Case Managers will move quickly to place them into their own apartment. A housing stability plan will be created with each person that will outline the steps necessary to obtain self-sufficiency.
- Each individual/family will receive a temporary, graduated rental subsidy over the course of 1 year. As this subsidy is decreased, they will be expected to pay the difference until they are able to fully support themselves or they reach the end of the one-year program, whichever comes first. Unspent resources from individuals who succeed quickly in the program will be reallocated to assist other participants.
- Each individual/family will receive tailored, wraparound supports to guide them toward a path of self-sufficiency. Job placement and mental health services will be prioritized but the supports can also range from employment training, education, counseling, substance use disorder treatment, etc.
- We will also leverage many of our other current programs to support these clients and/or families, such as Early Childhood Education and Assistance Program (ECEAP), Hunger Prevention, Dispute Resolution, Community Resource Centers, 211 Information and Referral Line, and Behavioral Health.
- We anticipate that we will be able to serve upwards of 30 individuals/families, utilizing 2 full-time case managers with mental health backgrounds.

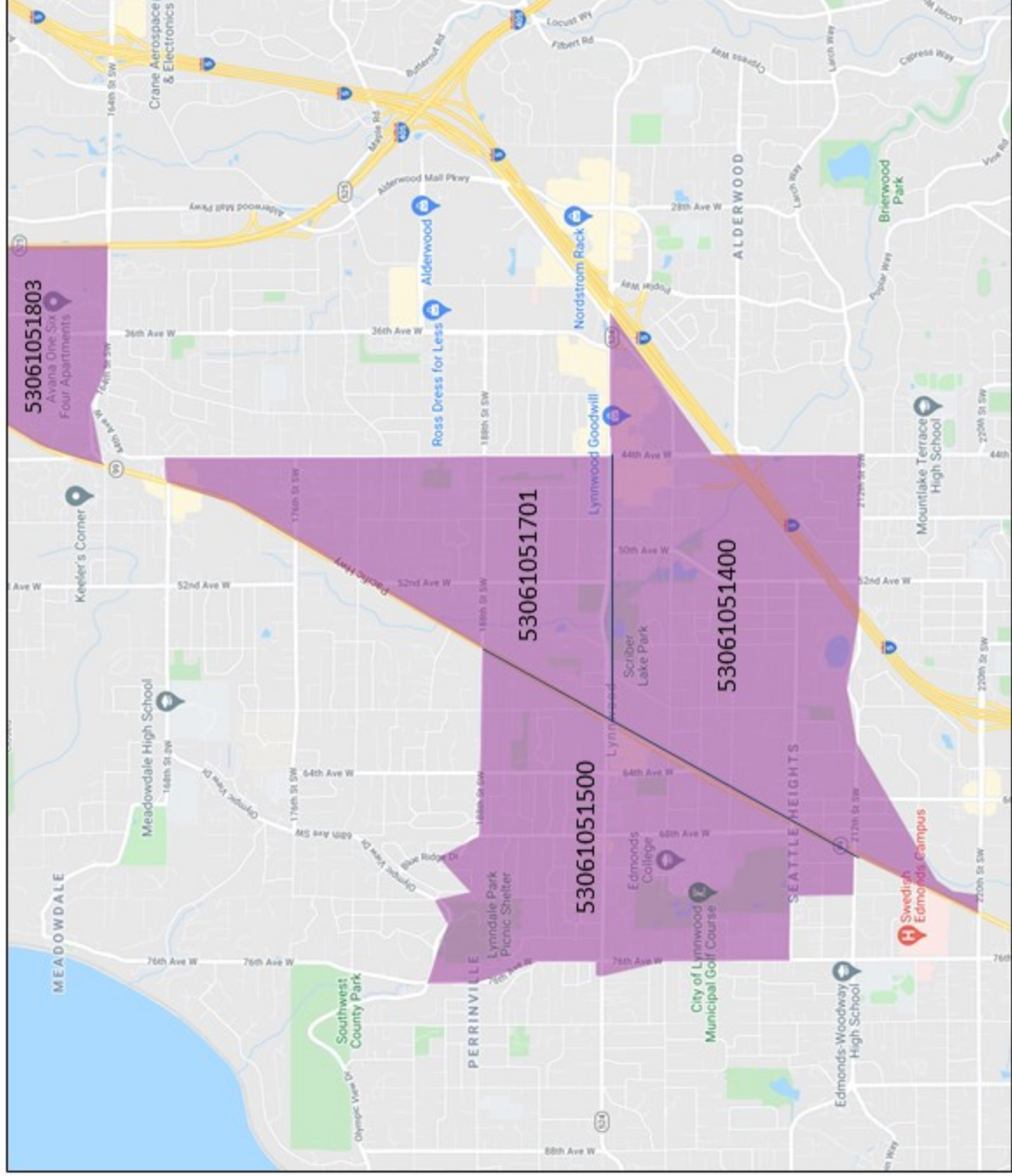

Qualified Census Tracts (QCT) 2021 & 2022, Lynnwood

Housing & Urban Development, Office of Policy Development & Research (PD&R)



QCT: A census tract (or equivalent geographic area defined by the Census Bureau) in which at least 50% of households have an income less than 60% of the area median gross income. In addition, it may also be a Qualified Census Tract if it has a poverty rate of at least 25%.
