<p><b>ADA Self-Evaluation and Transition Plan (SETP)</b></p> <p>An American with Disabilities Act (ADA) Self-Evaluation and Transition Plan is being developed. This will make the City of Lynnwood's facilities, parks, and public right-of-way accessible to all. The SETP demonstrates the City of Lynnwood's commitment to providing equal access. <p><b>ITS and Traffic Infrastructure</b></p> <p>Lynnwood’s Intelligent Transportation Systems (ITS) Program for efficient transportation management began in the 1990’s with a series of federal-aid grants supplemented with local match money. Projects under Lynnwood’s ITS Program installed communications infrastructure to all traffic signals within Lynnwood, signals in Lynnwood owned and operated by WSDOT, some traffic signals in neighboring agencies, and offices of Traffic Engineers for the cities of Mountlake Terrace and Edmonds. Program focus was to implement and maintain the following ITS components in support of the traveling public:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Central Advanced Traffic Management System; field controllers at signals and central client/server interface.</li> <li>• Central video detection system; field detectors and central client/server interface.</li> <li>• UPS (Uninterruptable Power Supply) for each traffic signal to keep traffic moving during short power outages.</li> <li>• PTZ (Pan-Tilt-Zoom) color cameras for live observation of congestion conditions.</li> <li>• Data Center to support a citywide traffic enterprise domain.</li> <li>• Traffic Center with Video Wall and PC workstations for operations, incident management, and data analysis.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Project managers will use appropriate outreach and notification protocols for individual projects under this program, working with the Public Affairs Officer/Communications Manager on larger and/or more challenging projects.</li> <li>• The City Engineer will oversee project managers and verify appropriate Title VI language and assurances are included in contracts / solicitations.</li> <li>• The Public Works Manager will report out in the Title VI Annual Report.</li> </ul>
