





- Accept hands-on facilitation




# CC + A Planning Goals

- 4. Meet the requirements of the Puget Sound Regional Council's Regional Centers Framework and **accommodate future growth allocations**.








# CC + A Planning Deliverables



The project scope includes the following deliverables to implement the CC+A vision:

- 1. Adopt a new **subarea plan** for this area, which incorporates the existing **City Center Subarea Plan**;
- 2. Issue a **SEPA Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) a**nd adopt a **planned action ordinance**; and
- 3. Update **development standards**, **design guidelines**, and a suite of **implementation strategies**.





# CITY CENTER + ALDERWOOD PLANNING FOR OUR FUTURE

#### Comprehensive Plan (1st GMA Plan Adopted in 1995)


- Policy LU-19: Accommodation of the population and employment growth... should primarily occur within the designated Lynnwood Regional Growth Center and along Highway 99.
- Policy CC-18.12: Continue to concentrate compact, mixed-use, walkable transit-oriented centers, specifically within the Regional Growth Center (which includes City Center), along Highway 99, around Alderwood Mall and within the College Mixed-Use District.

#### **Economic Development Action Plan (2015)**

 Action 3.1a.8: Identify and plan for the integration of Transit- Oriented-Development opportunities into and surrounding the future Lynnwood Sound Transit station.

#### Housing Action Plan (2021)

- Goal 4: Prepare for continued growth and increase the quality of life in Lynnwood.
- Strategy 1: Continue promoting housing in the Regional Growth Center (Alderwood and City Center) and along major transportation corridors.
- Strategy 9: Encourage amenities that enhance quality of life.



# Lynnwood Moving Forward: Our Community Vision (2009, 2015)


- To encourage a broad business base in sector, size and related employment, and promote high quality development.

- Capital Facilities/Improvement Projects and Actions Needed to Support the Plan




