The City of Lynnwood is preparing for the cold and wet season; here's what you can do to prepare too

- Cover and wrap hose bibs in the front and back of your house to prevent freezing pipes.
- Remove debris such as leaves and packed snow from storm drains. This will help alleviate drainage problems along roadways and prevent flooding or melted snow from refreezing.
- After a heavy rainfall our storm drains can be overloaded; avoid

- driving through water on the roadways and in parking lots. The average automobile can be swept off the road in 12 inches of moving water, and attempting to drive through water may also damage your engine.
- Prepare a 3-day emergency kit. Now is the time to gather emergency items such as enough food and water for your family for three days, flashlights and batteries, first-aid supplies, pet food, and other essential comfort items. For useful tips visit www.ready.gov.
- Use extreme caution while driving in inclement weather of any kind. Allow plenty of time to get to your destination, always yield to service vehicles such as plows, sanders, and transit buses, and avoid driving through large amounts of water. And, if you don't have to go out when the roads are dangerous, please don't!



Reminder: per City Code Chapter 21.42.C Residential Single-Family Zones - Keeping Small Animals as Pets - livestock, except for chickens and miniature goats, are not permitted in the City of Lynnwood. Roosters are prohibited.

Council Corner: Sister City and Friendship City Relationships Bring Value to Lynnwood

In May of 2015, Mayor Nicola Smith and the Lynnwood City Council passed Resolution 2015-10, which established a Lynnwood Sister City Program. We recognize that Lynnwood is a wonderfully diverse community, with residents coming from all corners of the world to call Lynnwood their home. The purpose of the Lynnwood Sister City/Friendship City Program is to build relationships, educational opportunities, tourism, and art and cultural exchanges between the people of Lynnwood and international cities. These relationships lead to international visits, exchange programs, humanitarian acts, art exchange and community events.

Our Friendship with the City of Chilpancingo, Guerrero-Mexico, has resulted in our newest public art display in the form of a signal box wrap (see image under *Lynnwood Adds Two New Signal Box Wraps* at left). The art signifies the importance of Mexican Culture and represents the friendship between the City of Lynnwood and Chilpancingo, Guerrero, Mexico. At the same time, this

cultural exchange illustrates binational relations, the celebration of diversity, and the reconnection of migrants with their roots beyond borders. Furthermore, this represents the union of two cultures. The signal box wrap is located at the convergence of Alderwood Mall Boulevard and Parkway. We are thrilled to have artwork from Guerrero on display in the heart of Lynnwood.

The Guerrero signal box wrap is not our first to represent a Lynnwood Sister City/Friendship City. We also have a signal box wrap on Highway 99 and 174th PL SW that represents our Korean Sister City of Damyang.

The City of Lynnwood currently has one Sister City which is Damyang, South Korea. We also have two Friendship Cities; Chilpancingo, Guerrero, Mexico, and Bole Kefle Ketema, Ethiopia.
