Advocating for Lynnwood's **Legislative Priorities**

The City of Lynnwood is proactively engaging with our State and Federal Legislators to advocate and convey our City's legislative priorities. Many decisions that are made in Olympia or in Washington D.C. have direct or indirect impacts on our City's ability to provide services to the people of Lynnwood. When our representatives know our City priorities, they are better equipped to represent our interests!

In January, US Congressman Rick Larsen joined Mayor Christine Frizzell and City Staff for an Infrastructure Tour of Lynnwood. With the passing of the Federal Infrastructure Bill, Lynnwood could be eligible for federal funds to help support our important infrastructure projects. Stops on the tour included the future Poplar Way Bridge, 42nd Ave W Project, Town Square Park, and then a stop at the Lynnwood City Center Station.

Lynnwood also participated in the Association of Washington Cities - City Action Days. During this virtual day, we met with Lieutenant Governor Danny Heck, Governor Jay Inslee's Advisory Staff, Senators Jesse Salomon and Marko Liias, and Representatives Lauren Davis, Cindy Ryu, Strom Petersen, and Lillian Ortiz-Self.

Plan for Lynnwood's Future!


The Development and Business Services Department is launching two planning efforts this Spring. We're inviting community members to get involved early to help guide Lynnwood's exciting future! All Are Welcome!

- The 2024 Comprehensive Plan Update will plan for Lynnwood's next 20 years. A Comprehensive Plan envisions a city's future. It describes a city's long-term vision for growth, infrastructure, and services. It articulates a series of goals and policies intended to guide the day-today decisions of elected officials and staff. Comprehensive Plans continually evolve to address long-term opportunities and challenges. The most recent version of Lynnwood's Comprehensive Plan was updated in 2015.
- The Regional Growth Center Subarea Plan will
 establish a vision and set of goals and policies for the
 City Center and Alderwood Mall areas. By 2037 this area
 will have two light rail stations and is expected to support
 several new residential units and jobs. Planning is needed
 to determine how the quality of life can be maintained
 and improved in the area.

Lynnwood Utility Billing

Throughout 2021, the City of Lynnwood installed new 'smart' water meters. These new water meters provide better leak detection, automate meter reading, and improve our service to you. During the installation, we took the extra time to ensure the new meters were functioning properly and providing accurate information for our billing process. Unfortunately, this caused a one-time bill delay for many customers. In an effort to get all customer billing cycles back on schedule, customers received more than one bill in December. Please note that customers received the regular 6 bills for the 2021 billing calendar year.

We understand this is an inconvenience and may cause a financial strain on households. We apologize and we are working hard to get all customers back on schedule for 2022. Our Utility Billing Staff is available to answer questions or help customers set up a payment plan. Due to high call and email volumes, it may take staff several days to respond. We thank you in advance for your patience.

MAJOR PROJECTS

Community Justice Center

This project will rebuild and re-imagine our Community Justice Center, with a purpose-built police department, a re-imagined misdemeanor jail, and a remodeled court, which will allow us the necessary space and function to bring the best justice services to our community. This project is currently under construction and anticipated to be completed in late 2023.

Community Recovery Center

A separate, but co-located Community Recovery Center will bring much needed mental health and substance use disorder treatment to our community. This facility will be available to community members, to law enforcement agencies, and to those in jail. The City of Lynnwood has received \$3 million in funding from Snohomish County, and we are actively seeking the remaining funding from the Washington State Legislature. This project is current under design, and it is anticipated that construction could be completed in late 2023.

196th St SW Improvement Project

Work continues on the 196th Improvement Project. The majority of work has now moved from the north side of 196th to the south side of 196th, with work progressing from 48th Ave W, east toward 40th Ave W.

Efforts are now focused on: Converting overhead utilities to underground (attached photo shows a utility vault being installed.), Digging (potholing) to confirm underground utility locations, Roadway excavation and grading, Clearing vegetation on the south side of 196th St SW, and Waterline and utility placement.

Everett Link Extension

The planning for Everett Link Extension continues with completion of the Early Scoping Information Report in late 2021. This included identifying six possible station locations for our future West Alderwood Station with five possible guideway alignments. The Sound Transit project has continued to review these alternatives including the comments received from the public during Early Scoping. Lynnwood Link Extension

Sound Transit construction continues at the Lynnwood Transit Center. This includes construction of the guideway, station, and parking garage. In late 2022, the parking garage will be completed and open for use. Construction remains on schedule for the beginning of light rail service in July 2024.

Northline Village: Behind the Scenes Work Continues

In 2019, the Lynnwood City Council approved a contract for the development of the Lynnwood Square site, for 18 acres of transitoriented development. This site will include approximately 1,400 multifamily units; 500,000 square feet of office use; 200,000 square feet of retail; entertainment space; two parks and new grid streets.

Since City Council's approval, the developer, Merlone Geier Partners, and the City of Lynnwood have been working to ready the site for construction. This includes reviewing subdivision documents, phasing plans, utility details, street lighting, street designs, off-site improvements, and so much more. This work is crucial to ensure smooth construction creating a safe environment, but also a vibrant and functioning site for the City Center. Groundbreaking at Ember Apartments in City Center

In January, Trent Development and the City of Lynnwood celebrated the groundbreaking of a new City Center building. Located at the southeast corner of 198th Street SW and 40th Avenue West, this project will be a part of the future City Center Promenade. The Ember Apartments will be approximately 9,000 square feet of commercial space with 361 multifamily units, 72 of which will be income restricted units. This project represents a high-quality design project with interior open space, increased housing opportunities, and vibrant commercial space in our City Center.
