The City of Lynnwood's Consumer

is a performance measure of the quality of
water supplied by the City of Lynnwood.
The report describes local drinking water
sources, testing conducted on the water,
allowable limits of substances, substances
detected, and the levels of those substances.

Get Current on Your City Utilities Past-Due Balance

The City provides drinking water, sanitary sewer, and stormwater sewer services to all properties in the City. During the COVID-19 pandemic, many utility customers struggled to stay current on their utility charges. In part because of the billing delays created by the upgrade of all water meters during 2021, the City has allowed extra time for customers to get caught up on their utility bills. However, beginning July 1, 2022, the City will return to the standard practice of charging late fees and or disconnecting water service when bills are not paid. Municipal Court Offering LFO Amnesty

The Lynnwood Municipal Court has coordinated with the collection agency Linebarger Goggan Blair & Sampson (LGBS) to offer an amnesty program aimed at clearing delinquent legal financial obligations. The amnesty program will be offered the entire month of May 2022. Individuals with delinquent fines in collection status will receive the benefit of having accrued interest waived if payment is made in full during the month of May. Please note that collection costs will not be waived, only accrued interest. Offering an LFO amnesty will help eliminate barriers to obtaining or reinstating driver's licenses.



Community Justice Center

This project will rebuild and re-imagine our Community Justice Center, with a purpose-built police department, a re-imagined misdemeanor jail, and a remodeled court, which will allow us the necessary space and function to bring the best justice services to our community. This project is currently under construction and anticipated to be completed in late 2023.

Community Recovery Center

A separate, but co-located Community Recovery Center will bring much needed mental health and substance use disorder treatment to our community. This facility will be available to community members, to law enforcement agencies, and to those in jail. The City of Lynnwood has received \$12 million in funding from the State's Capital Budget, \$3 million in funding from Snohomish County, and \$1.94 million grant in partnership with Recovery Innovations International. This project is current under design, and it is anticipated that construction could be completed in late 2023.

42nd Ave W Improvement Project: Online Open House

Starting on May 11, visit the 42nd Ave W Project page, www.LynnwoodWA.gov/42Ave, to view a pre-recorded Open House and submit your questions and comments.

During this presentation we will discuss: Proposed corridor cross-section, Right-of-way (ROW) impacts to surrounding parcels, Construction schedule, Implementation strategies, Design documents to clarify frontage improvements, and Site amenities and design features.

196th St SW Improvement Project

The majority of the utility work has been completed on the north side of 196th. Utility work is now being focused on the south side of 196th, beginning at 48th Ave W and progressing east toward 36th Ave W.

The construction crews are clearing vegetation, converting the overhead utility's such as electric and fiber to underground, upgrading the waterline services, building retaining walls, roadway excavation and grading, placing curb and gutters, pouring sidewalks.


