LSC is partnering with the American Heart Association to bring you Lynnwood Senior Center Self-Check Blood Pressure Station.

Taking your blood pressure is important self-care. LSC has long offered the service. We have two amazing volunteers, Remy and Chin. Both retired RNs, they offer blood pressure screening on Tuesdays noon to 1pm, and Wednesdays 11am to noon. Knowing that not everyone is here at those times, and that it's better

to measure more often, LSC and the American Heart Association (AHA) are making blood pressure testing more available and an easy habit to add to your daily routine. The AHA provided equipment and guidance to set up a blood pressure station accessible to everyone, every day, anytime the Center is open. The lobby table's decked out with heart-healthy resources, instructions, tips, and logs for you to keep track of your numbers — all available in multiple

languages. It's simple to check out a blood pressure cuff from the front desk and get started on your next visit. The American Heart Association is appreciated for

helping us promote blood pressure health and awareness.
