**RESOLUTION NO. 2017-02** 

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF LYNNWOOD WASHINGTON, ADOPTING THE SCRIBER CREEK CORRIDOR MANAGEMENT PLAN, STATE ROUTE 99 TO SCRIBER LAKE, PREPARED BY HERRERA ENVIRONMENTAL CONSULTANTS, DATED OCTOBER 2016.

WHEREAS, there is a history of repeating flooding problems throughout the Scriber Creek Basin on both public and private land, and the City has received and responded to numerous complaints regarding flooding within the basin; and

WHEREAS, it is in best interest of the City and the affected residents and business owners to work together to understand the viable solutions, respective costs and constraints associated with a series of basin-wide projects that will address the different issues that contribute to the ongoing public and private drainage problems within the basin; and

WHEREAS, the City engaged a Citizen's Advisory Committee to establish project goals and objectives, and develop a Project Charter to guide further evaluation of a suite of projects within the corridor to address these flooding issues; and

WHEREAS, the Citizen's Advisory Committee's Final Report and Recommendations to Lynnwood City Council, endorsed by the Committee and dated July 2014, contained a list of recommended projects that guided the Study phase of the project; and

WHEREAS, the culmination of all of the effort of this project is the Scriber Creek Corridor Management Plan, State Route 99 to Scriber Lake; and

WHEREAS, this Plan evaluated all of these projects and makes recommendations for implementation.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LYNNWOOD, WASHINGTON, RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

**Section 1.** The Lynnwood City Council hereby:

- 1. Adopts the Scriber Creek Corridor Management Plan, State Route 99 to Scriber Lake in its entirety.
- 2. Will use the adopted Plan to guide flood alleviation projects within the identified corridor.
- 3. As is appropriate, will coordinate with private property owners to design, construct, and fund the projects identified in the Plan.

**Section 2.** It is the purpose of this Resolution to provide for the health, welfare, and safety of the general public, and not to create or otherwise establish or designate any particular class or group of persons who will or should be especially protected of benefited by the terms of this Resolution.

**Section 3.** Nothing contained in this Resolution is intended to be, nor shall be construed to create or form the basis for any liability on the part of the City or its officers, agents, and employees for any damage resulting from the failure to comply with the provisions of this Resolution.
